This course uses specific issues and examples to build on basic year one theory relating to ethics, the law and the nursing profession. The student will continue to examine the Canadian Health Care System with particular emphasis on the local system as it affects the client and the nurse. The impact of nursing history on present day nursing is briefly examined.
