

Ends in View and Processes:

Ends in View	Process
This course will introduce learners to the two dominant knowledge paradigms and the process of concept analysis. Learners will have the opportunity to develop the ability to access relevant literature and develop scholarly writing skills. Through the process of family assessment, learners will have opportunities to gain insight into people's experiences with chronic health challenges focusing on the concept of caring in this context.	The faculty's intent is that a caring relationship will develop between the teacher and learners, indicative of the type of relationship that learners will be developing with their clients. It is hoped that learners will understand that caring involves challenges, critical thinking, and nurturing and that this will be the nature of the relationship in the seminars. It is expected that learners will access and examine relevant literature and share their practice experiences in class each week. Preparation for class will contribute to the quality of the learning activity experiences and will facilitate success in the course. The learners will be encouraged to engage in the reflective process.
