Course Description:

The general aim of this course is to familiarize the student with:

- a) some basic concepts of criminology;
- b) some of the major societal problems which are generated by the prevalence of crime in the 1980's.

Objectives:

- b) Drug Use, Misuse, Abuse
- c) Social Problems related to substance abuse
- d) Social Control

3) Mental Disorders

- a) The Nature of Mental Illness
- b) Epidemiology of Mental Disorders
- c) Mental Disorders as a Social Problem
