PHILOSOPHY/GOALS

This course will prepare the student to recognize, prevent and/or effectively mange potentially dangerous situations of unacceptable behavior from correctional clients. Those under stress or in a state of crisis find it difficult to function "normally" thus making the tasks of the correctional workers difficult and often hazardous. At the same time, the correctional worker needs to have knowledge and skills to feel confident during crisis and keep his/her stress as low as possible so as to be most effective in managing those for whom he/she is responsible.
