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HOSPITAL ORIENTATION

MED 107-2

- PURPOSE:** The underlying purpose is to familiarize the student with the hospital and clinical settings where illness is always present. This experience usually dictates whether the student continues in Medical Laboratory or transfers into a related program such as Chemistry, etc.
- VISITATION SCHEDULE:** The students are divided into groups of one or two and they rotate, each week visiting a different facility. The instructor also rotates and visits various facilities covering different students each week.
- FACILITIES VISITED:** Plummer Hospital (5 weeks) - hematology
- microbiology
- clinical
- chemistry
- blood banking
- General Hospital (5 weeks) - same divisions as above
- Group Health Centre (1 week) - general lab experience
- Public Health Lab (1 week) - microbiology, water analysis, V.D. etc
- Algoma Steel Health Lab (1 week) - industrial hygiene, public health (optional)
- COMMON CLASSES - all students**
- Week 1 - how to set up a log book
- schedule is arranged
- Week 6 - review sessions - progress - problems etc.
- EVALUATION:**
- attendance only - SAT or UNSAT
 - students not interested in Medical Laboratory any longer usually drop out of this course early and do not attend further classes
